Our school breakfast program started October 25th and runs Monday to Friday from 8:00-8:20am in the multipurpose room. - William Watt




WEIGHT ROOM

HUMAN LIBRARY EVENT

A Human Library event will be held at Wellington Secondary in the Library Learning Commons Thursday, November 17 8:30 am to 3:00 pm during all four classes. Some students will be attending with their classes and some individually by permission slip.



DON'T JUDGE A BOOK BY ITS COVER

The Human Library™ is an equalities project, created by the Danish youth organisation "Stop the Violence" in 2000 and it is now operational in more than 60 countries. It was developed to challenge societal prejudices wherever and for whatever reasons they occur, and to promote respect for difference and diversity in our communities. The Human Library is where real people are on loan to readers - a place where difficult questions are expected, appreciated and answered and where readers are encouraged to learn about ideas, cultures, lifestyles, and other life experiences through conversation.

At Wellington Secondary, students or teachers will sign up to attend the Human Library event, choose a "title" table to sit at and enter a discussion with that "book". Each table will have a maximum of 3 students per "book" and after 20 minutes they will be rotated to a new table and a new discussion. Our titles so far include: Female police officer, soup kitchen worker, empowerment coach, gay man, Baha'i faith, Sikh religion, ex-homeless person, Senior citizen, Metis Struggles, How did I get to be a Physician?, Gardening and Sustainability Tips, Parole Officer: How to get our of Jail, Chinese culture, Turkish culture, Palestinian culture, Indonesian culture, Nanaimo Community Living, and Islamic VIU student.

Liz Sansoucy-Jones has successfully organized this event twice in SD68 (2013, 2015). Students in the past have found this event to be a moving and memorable experience...one that surprises some of them.
