GRADE 9 IMMUNIZATION CONSENT PACKAGES

Watch for immunization consent packages for grade 9 students that will be sent home early in the fall. Please discuss the information in the consent package and involve your child in the decision to provide consent to immunization. This should be used as an opportunity for adolescents to start making decisions about their own health.

Although a child may be immunized with the consent of a parent/guardian or representative, a grade 9 student can make an informed decision regarding immunization regardless of parental consent or refusal. This is referred to as "mature minor consent."
