1. Grab the Private App store URL from your email and open the link in Safari on an iOS device. Click Install Now.

- Under the "Enterprise App" heading, you'll see a profile for the developer. (Apple changed "profile" to "device management" in 9.2)
- Click "Bizness Apps Inc." Then "Trust Bizness Apps Inc." (This is the software upon which your app has been built)

- 4. Complete your General Application Form online and print a hard copy to be submitted to your school contact person prior to the deadline. Submit your online application only once you are satisfied that it is complete. It cannot be accessed/edited once you hit SUBMIT.
- 5. If a separate application or other requirements are listed for an award, these must be printed, completed and submitted with the General Application Form to your school contact person prior to the deadline.
