- 2. Carefully review the guidelines for applying and receiving an award in the NLSF Awards Selection Booklet prior to completing the General Application.



- 3. Carefully review the list of awards available in the NLSF Awards Selection Booklet and note any additional applications, letter/essays or references that may be required.
- 4. Complete your General Application Form online and print a hard copy to be submitted to your school contact person prior to the deadline. Submit your online application only once you are satisfied that it is complete. It cannot be accessed/edited once you hit SUBMIT.
- 5. If a separate application or other requirements are listed for an award, these must be printed, completed and submitted with the General Application Form to your school contact person prior to the deadline.

This year's application deadline is Friday, February 9, 2018 @ Noon




