Principals Message

Wellington Community,

I would like to start by wishing all of you a very warm, happy and healthy holiday season! This is a busy time of year for many families, and certainly for our students. First semester will be winding down in a few weeks, and we will be heading into final assessments. I invite you to help us encourage our students to try and maintain focus on academic progress and success through the end of January and the semester. Our teaching staff is eager to assist your child in meeting those academic goals, and are available to communicate with you as to how best to do so. Our study buddies program, which is an in-person academic support program offered by Mrs. Balcombe afterschool in Room B205, is an excellent way to get personal support in multiple subject areas in addition to the extra help offered by classroom teachers.

A little further along in this newsletter, you will find the schedule for Semester One assessments. The week of January 21-25 will see all students attending full and regular class schedules on Monday the 21st, and Tuesday the 22nd, with students scheduled into a variety of assessments by their individual classroom teachers from Wednesday the 23rd to Friday the 25th. This schedule will allow for classroom assessments, the Grade 8 Showcase of Learning, opportunities for individual assessments and course completion, as well as BC Ministry exams. You will receive communication from classroom teachers regarding assessments for each course.

Over the next few weeks we will be distributing Course Planning Guides to students and parents to help prepare for the 2019 -2020 course selection process. Students will select courses and the end of January and the beginning of February for next school year. The course Planning Guide will provide you with information to help you choose areas of interest and courses necessary for graduation. Please take time to read the Guide and ask questions to make sure you are making informed decisions. The course selection process will help us determine our school timetable for next year, more specifically, the courses we are able to offer to students. Accurate information is essential for us to hire staff and offer the courses our students choose and require to meet their future academic goals. As many of you are aware, it is difficult to make substantial changes later in the year to student timetables, which is further reason to choose the appropriate courses now.

From time to time, I like to remind parents and guardians that we continue to try and find new ways to support distracted learners in our classroom. Some of those distractions are related to outside stressors and fatigue, like late-night gaming or social issues. Through our counselling department, we have a number of strategies to help students with these concerns, and try our best to identify and recognize them early. If you feel your child would benefit from such support, please do not hesitate to speak with our counselling department, who are all very-well trained in this area. For other forms of distraction to learning in the classroom, such as personal electronic devices (used for non-educational purposes) I ask that you continue to communicate with your child and support us in trying to have students engage in the lesson as provided by the teacher, and not in communication with others. It is a more prevalent issue every year, and while we encourage the use of technology for educational purposes, many devices are still used in class as merely a distraction from the lesson. Your support, as always, is greatly appreciated.

Secondary specialized academies provide students with an opportunity to pursue their areas of interest while completing their academic studies.



School Registration 2019-2020

To register your child in Nanaimo-Ladysmith Public Schools, the online, centralized registration will begin on January 9, 2019 at 8 a.m. Pacific Standard Time. The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you.

Take a moment and ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. Is my child new to Nanaimo-Ladysmith Public Schools?
- Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2019
 that will be entering Kindergarten? Applications must be received by June 15, 2019 to
 ensure a placement in your child's catchment-area school.
- 3. Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
- 4. Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? Applications will be received until January 31, 2019, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2019. Late French Immersion Students are placed as space permits.
- 5. Do I want to register my child in secondary academies?
